Message from the Principal

Congratulations to our Reader's Cup Teams. Our teams came first and second and set the record for the highest points in the competition. Well done teams! A big thank you to Mrs Witts and Ms Olive for their work in coaching these teams. We are a reading school and this recognises the work of our daily school programs in developing reading comprehension in our students.

An update on our 'Investing 4 Success' funding. Over the past four years, schools have received additional funding to support students. The plan is published on our school website every year of how this money is allocated. We use this money to support our reading program within the school to ensure that every student has a small group explicit reading lesson four times a week. We have highly trained teacher aides working alongside teachers in classroom to deliver the 'High Reliability Literacy Procedures' to students in a guided reading lesson. This is where our students visualise, pose questions that the text may answer, unpack vocab and use in context, paraphrase and summarise. The students are being taught strategies to decode and comprehend so they can independently do this. The majority of the 'Investing 4 Success' funds goes on teacher aide wages to support our students and on resource purchasing to ensure we have quality texts available for our students.



A big thank you to our P.E staff Mr O'Neill and Mr Bird for their organisation of the Junior Sports Carnival. This is a busy time of year for our PE department with sports carnivals, nominations for KCD sports and the finalisation of the Year 6 interschool sports. Thank you also to Teachers and Teacher Aides for assisting on the day. What I love about the day is the focus on participation of all students and trying out a number of different sports – individually and in teams.

Sports News – Year 6 KCD Friday Afternoon Sport

What an exciting conclusion to Term 2, KCD Friday Afternoon Sport we had. With five teams making the semi-final stages Taranganba State School came away with two trophies and two runner-up results.

Our Netball team (who finished the minor rounds as the top team) didn't put a step wrong all competition. With a wealth of talent available to coach Duggan, the girls cruised into the final, beating St Benedict's Green 9-4. They then came up against a stronger St Benedict's Blue outfit who qualified second overall and came out winners 12-7. Ms Duggan is now looking forward to the Regional Shield in Term 3 to see if the girls can continue their winning ways.

Taranganba Black and Taranganba Turquoise both qualified for the final of the boys Soccer competition. Taranganba School Black qualified, beating St Benedict's Emerald in the semi and Taranganba School Turquoise qualified, beating Farnborough Purple. In a tightly contested final Taranganba School Black came out winners in an entertaining match winning 1-0.

Our A grade Rugby League team qualified third and came up against the might of the Development Cup winners in Sacred Heart. To the teams credit they played their best game of the competition going down 20-12 in a close game. Coach O'Donnell has a bit of work to do before the Regional Shield but he feels that with the team he has at his disposal, they should be able to go deep into the campaign.
