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At Taranganba State School we recognise that homework provides students with opportunities to:

- consolidate their classroom learning 0
- establish positive behaviours for lifelong learning beyond the classroom 0
- involve and inform family members in their learning 0
- develop effective time management skills 0

We value homework that:

- enhances student learning 0
- is purposeful and relevant to students' needs 0
- is appropriate to the students' year level 0
- develops independence as a learner 0
- clearly relates to class work 0
- consolidates literacy and numeracy skills 0

GUIDELINES

Our school community recognises that the homework requirements for students may vary according to year level, a child's individual learning needs and the classroom focus at any given time. Homework is intended to engage students in independently and may encompass/include:

- revision and critical reflection to consolidate learning (practising for mastery) 0
- applying knowledge and skills in new contexts (a topic of interest, an authentic local issue) 0
- pursuing knowledge individually (investigating, researching, writing, designing, making) 0
- preparing for forthcoming classroom learning (collecting relevant materials and items). 0

Prep to Year 2

In Years Prep to Year 2, homework is generally not more than 1 hour per week. Many activities at home can assist children to develop literacy, numeracy and problem-solving skills. Homework tasks may include:

- daily reading with parents/caregivers or other family members 0
- numeracy revision Ο
- literacy revision 0
- writing for meaningful purposes 0
- conversations about what is happening at school 0

Year 3 to Year 6

Homework in Year 3 and Year 4 could be up to but generally not more than 2-3 hours per week. Homework in Year 5 and Year 6 could be up to but generally not more than 3-4 hours per week. Some homework can be completed daily or over a weekly or fortnightly period and may include:

- daily independent reading 0
- extension of class work Literacy and numeracy 0
- Grammar, punctuation, vocabulary or morphology 0
- Number facts, operations and place value work 0



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ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Teachers:

Teachers can help students establish a routine of regular, independent study by:

- ensuring their school's homework policy is implemented 0
- setting homework on a regular basis 0
- clearly communicating the purpose, benefits and expectations of homework 0
- Setting homework that is directly related to class work and appropriate to students' learning 0 needs
- explicitly teaching strategies to develop organisational and time-management skills and 0 providing opportunities to practice these strategies through homework
- considering other academic and personal development activities (school based or 0 other) that students could be engaged in when setting homework
- discussing with parents and caregivers any developing problems concerning their child's 0 homework and suggesting strategies to assist with their homework.

Students:

Students can take responsibility for their own learning by:

- discussing with their parents/caregivers homework expectations 0
- returning homework consistently Ο
- accepting responsibility for the completion of homework tasks 0
- seeking assistance when difficulties arise 0
- organising their time to manage home obligations, participation in physical activity and sports 0 and recreational and cultural activities.

Parents and Caregivers:

Parents and caregivers can help their children by:

- showing a positive interest in their classroom work and achievements 0
- reading to them, talking with them and involving them in tasks at home 0
- helping them to complete tasks by discussing key questions or directing them to resources 0
- encouraging them to organise their time and take responsibility for their learning and balance 0 their homework with other activities.
- encouraging them to read and to take an interest in and discuss current local, national and Ο international events
- establishing routines at home to complete homework 0
- contacting the relevant teacher to discuss any concerns about the nature of homework and 0 their children's approach to the homework
